The word "cells" strongly suggests imprisonment, confinement, and a lack of freedom. It implies the setting is cold, harsh, and controlled, much like a jail or detention centre.
20.	What is the difference between a democracy and dictatorship ?	 The difference between a democracy and a dictatorship lies in how power is gained and used, and how much freedom people have. In a democracy, power comes from the people. In a dictatorship, power comes from control — not choice.
