Europe is a continent located entirely in the Northern Hemisphere.

- Europe covers about 10.18 million km² and 2% of the Earth's surface.
- Europe has a high population density(2nd) compared to other continents due to its small landmass in comparison.
- It has a population density of 72.9 per Km2
- It has around 50 countries-(sources differ)
- Some countries are located in Europe and Asia e.g. Russia and Turkey.
- Its population is around 750 million people.





The European Union

In 1949, the Council of Europe was founded with the idea of unifying Europe to achieve common goals and prevent future wars.

- Not to be confused with Europe the continent-it is a political alliance. Not all European countries are members.
- It is a unique economic and political union of 27 member states.
- The currency of most countries of the European Union is the euro.
